Director's Pen...

Kripa Social Welfare Society (Kripa) has been working in the community since last 48 years with an aim to empower the people, especially the marginalised sections of the society, by restoring their human dignity and enhancing their capacity to build a human community where all enjoy equal rights and opportunities permeated with the values of peace, harmony, concern for environment and sensitivity to the needy. Kripa has direct contact with 262 villages and slums in four districts of Madhya Pradesh. It has adopted an integrated approach for the total empowerment of the people. At present Kripa has 955 self help groups, 94 farmers groups, 196 children's parliaments, 113 adolescent groups and 34 core groups in its credit. These community based organisations help Kripa to capacitate its members for ensuring their participation for community development. Kripa provides different facilitation meetings to Self Help Groups members to bring social, economic, political, technical, educational changes and enhance a value based life in the society. Needy children are given care and protection and other children are encouraged to understand their rights and to motivate them to realise their rights in their life. At present Kripa runs three Child Lines to assist the children who are in need of care and protection. Adolescent girls are organised with an intention to equip and to empower them to lead a dignified life. Different training helps them to understand the social, mental and other changes in their life and to prepare them to face the challenges during this period.

Farmers are other categories of people taken care of by the Kripa. Though farmers in our target area are involved in mono and cash crops, chemical farming Kripa is trying its best to mobilise the farmers to reflect on traditional farming, mixed crop and food crops emphasising on organic farming to protect nature by adopting profitable eco-friendly agriculture. Kripa also insists the village community to use available uncultivated vegetables and fruits. Kripa promotes the farmers for planting trees and to start kitchen gardens in their field for their intake. Core Groups are as equivalent to the Village Development Committee which are formed with an intention to mobilise the community to ensure their active participation in good governance. These efforts not only help the people to work on their issues but also increase the participation of people in the Gram Sabha and Public Hearing as well as encourage the emerging leaders to develop their leadership qualities. Kripa and its wing Saathi intensively work in community health, especially focussing on HIV/AIDs, TB, Malnutrition, Adolescent Health, MMR, IMMR and so on. Saathi is exclusively working for the prevention, care and support of the PLHAs. Saathi conducts different programmes like awareness, rapid testing to prevent the spread of HIV in the community. All these efforts of Kripa deliberately promote peace and harmony in the communities. Another significant effort by Kripa is the promotion of gender equity in its efforts.

It is my obligation to acknowledge the contribution of many dedicated people for the successful implementation of various projects in the field. I take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks to our target groups, priests, nuns, funding agencies, civil administrative bodies, bankers, field staff, office staff, Governing Body & General Body members, other stakeholders and allies for supporting Kripa to realize its vision, mission and objectives.

History of Kripa Social Welfare Society:

The Social Apostolate of the Diocese of Ujjain came into existence in 1972. It has a humble beginning by assisting the poor and marginalised people in the villages to construct houses, mud roads, dig open wells under food for work programmes. Then Social Apostolate stepped into the field of agriculture in 1976 by launching its first lift irrigation project and by capacitating the poor and marginalised farmers to cultivate wheat in their field. Focussing on the economic development of the community we have initiated an animal husbandry programme in the year 1979 and simultaneously activities related to health specifically focussing on mother and child community health awareness programmes along with the distribution of bulgur, oil, milk powder, etc., in the villages. Fr. George Thoomkuzhy had been facilitating the social work activities of the Diocese of Ujjain from 1973 to 1979. Fr. Sebastian Elanjimattam was appointed as the first director of this unit in the year 1979. The Diocese of Ujjain has expanded its services in the field of community health in the year 1982 by concentrating on antenatal care and Tetanus - toxoide for pregnant women, awareness on health and nutrition. The Diocese has established St. Joseph's Vocational Training center to provide vocational training to the boys of rural areas in 1983. Fr. Thomas Thekkel was appointed the director, social apostolate in 1990. The Social Apostolate of the Diocese of Ujjain became a legal entity on 28th December 1992 by registering the organisation under the Societies Registration Act 1860 with the registration number of 25653 and adopted the name Kripa Social Welfare Society (Kripa). Kripa has extended its health related activities in the year 1994 by introducing activities related to health and hygiene. The same year Kripa stepped into the field of non formal education introducing non formal schools for dropout children in the villages. Seeing the need of supporting poor children for their education Kripa started Other Child Food Programme (OCF) for children in different boardings in 1994. During that time the SMCH programme was extended to different villages in Shajapur and Rajgargh districts. In 1996 school feeding and individual health care programmes were started. In 1997, Kripa started a scholarship programme for poor and bright children in its working area. Kripa has stepped into the field of community mobilisation by forming different Community Based Organisations in the year 1998.

Kripa received a new director, Fr. Kurian Kochettonnil, in the year 1999. Kripa was registered under FCRA in the year 2000 and the same year it started to work among the child labourers in the urban area by opening bridge course centers. Giving special focus on natural resource management, Kripa started watershed programmes in the year 2003. In 2004, Kripa laid the foundation stone for its training center at Chandessary, Ujjain and developed a full fledged training center by 2007. Kripa started income generation programmes in the year 2005 to assist the poor and marginalised women for economic empowerment and the same year started Balwadies in the slum areas to support the children. In 2006 Kripa started a shelter home for street children but it was closed in 2008. In the year 2006 Kripa received its first assistant director in the form of Fr. D. Kunnath. Kripa Started the Child Line project on 1st April 2008. Fr. Sunil George Konrackal was appointed the Director, and Fr. Jacob Nirappel was appointed the Financial Administrator of Kripa (a new post created) on 29th June 2008.

Kripa has been working in the field of child rights and child protection since 2008. From 2009 onwards, Kripa has been providing its services in the Juvenile Justice Homes at Ujjain. From the same year the organisation has revisited its mission, vision and objectives and enhanced existing mission, vision and objectives. Special focus was given to the organizational development process with structure, system and policies. Kripa has been working on TB and drug-de-addiction since 2010 and stepped in the field of good governance in the year 2012 by motivating the people to play their active role for the development of the communities adopting the concept of people led approach. In the same year itself CRS and Caritas India did the assessment of the organization. Kripa amplified its work among the children focusing on prevention,



intervention and rehabilitation. Kripa recommenced its work among the dropout children by initiating the vocation training programmes in the year 2015. Since 2016 Kripa has been working to capacitate women to work on collective income generation programmes and in the year 2017, they have proved that they can run the collective IGP by starting the first Milk Collection Unit. Since 2017 Kripa has initiated its work on agriculture by focusing on traditional farming and malnutrition and similarly concentration was given to empower the adolescent girls.

Saathi Care Home, the HIV/AIDS wing of Kripa Social Welfare Society has been working for the people living with HIV/AIDS since 2004, with an aim to assist the targeted people to lead a dignified life. During that time Saathi initiated activities like awareness programmes, home based care for the infected and affected in different villages and slums. Saathi started its care and support programme: like home visits, counseling, regular inpatient and outpatient services etc., in the year 2006. Saathi formed the Ujjain network for positive people in the year 2006. At the demand of Saathi's services new offices were opened at Mehidpur (2006), Shajapur and Rajgarh (2007), Nagda (2010) and Agar (2014). In the year 2008 Saathi started the first Community Care Center (CCC) in the State for the treatment of the infected people. Since 2010 Saathi has been running boarding for infected children. In 2011 Saathi started facilitated counseling and testing center (FICTC) with the approval of Madhya Pradesh State AIDS Control Society (MPSACS). In collaboration with AHF India Cares, Saathi started Rapid Test Programme (field level HIV testing) in 2011. The new ministry for mental health was started in June 2014. From the year 2017 onwards Saathi has been working for the Prevention of Mother to Child HIV Transmission Programme.

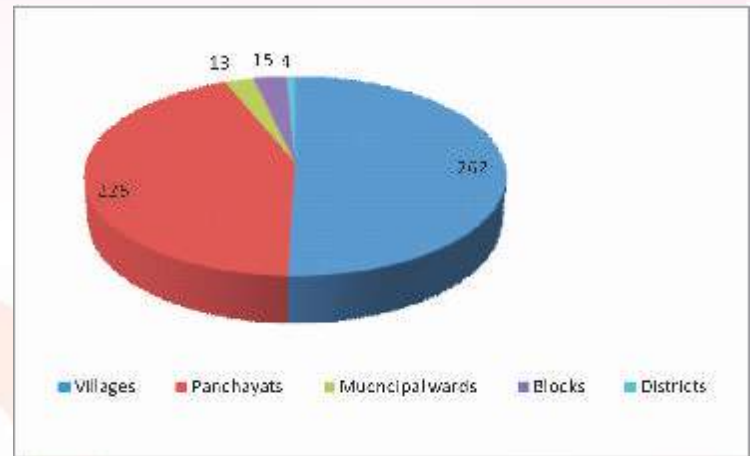

Kripa's Presence:

Kripa has been working for the last 48 years in the villages and slums for the welfare of the poor and marginalized people. At present Kripa works in four civil districts, Ujjain, Shajapur, Agar-Malwa and Rajgarh of Madhya Pradesh. Kripa has direct and regular interaction with 262 villages, 225 Panchayats, 13 Municipal wards of 15 blocks in the four districts. Beside these villages Kripa has reached out to 963 villages through PMCT programmes, Rapid Test programme, TB programme and Child Line programmes. Kripa works among women, farmers, adolescents and children in the communities. At present Kripa has formed 955 Self Help Groups, 94 Farmers Groups, 113 Adolescent Groups, 196 Children's Groups and 34 Core Groups.



Legal and financial management

Kripa social welfare society is registered as a non-profit making organisation under Societies Act 1860 in the year 1992. Organisation has also been registered under Section 12 A and 80-G of Income Tax Act, TDS and Foreign Contribution Regulation Act. TDS and professional Tax are deducted as per Income Tax Rules. Income tax return is filed every year. FC-3 return is submitted to the Home ministry every year. Audited financial reports and audited utilization certificates are sent to funding agencies as per their requirement.

Mangament:

Kripa Social Welfare Society has 11 members in its General Body and 7 members in its Governing Body. Members of the Governing Body are elected from the General Body. The Governing Body meets from time to time to take policy decisions, review the progress of the projects/ programmes and the finance. Governing body also makes the assessment whether implemented activities are helping the organisation to achieve its goals and vision. Members in the Governing Body have no blood relationship among themselves. Neither of the Governing Body Members draw salary from the organisation. None of the governing body members has done foreign trip using the fund of the organisation. Director of Kripa Social Welfare Society is responsible for the execution of all the affairs and activities, including the day to day administration in consultation with the governing Body. Kripa has a separate finance officer in place to take care of the day to day finance matters of the organisation. Kripa has three full time assistant directors who are involved in the implementation of the activities. Kripa has got 33 local offices in four districts and has got 28 local coordinators (either religious sisters or priests) in each local office to implement and monitor the programmes. Projects are managed by the coordinators/ field coordinators. At field level, organization has a local coordinator and field staff to organise and capacitate the community members.

Infrastructure:

The head office of Kripa Social Welfare Society is located in Ujjain and branch offices are at Rajgarh and Agar-Malwa. Head office is well equipped with basic amenities and branch offices are having basic equipments needed to run the office in a professional manner. Organisation has a local office in each place from where the



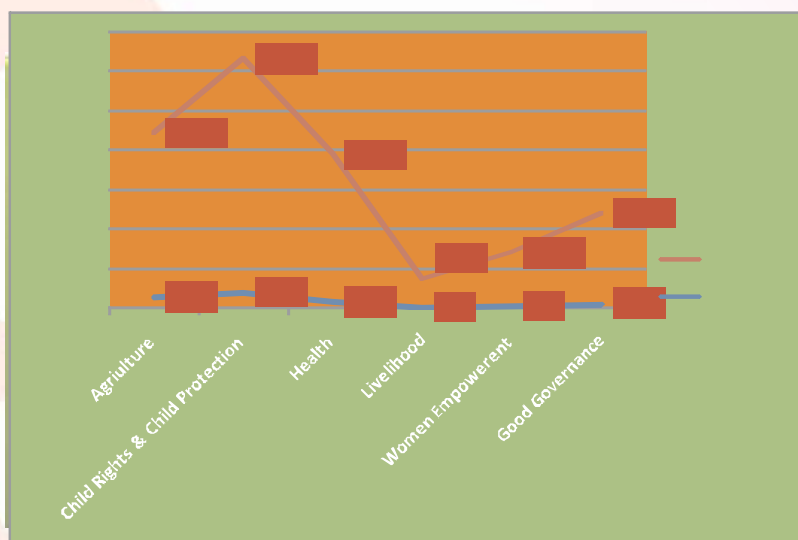
project is operated. All these local offices are provided by the Diocese of Ujjain. Saathi has separate administrative offices with all needed facilities. It has four field level operating offices.

Kripa Team:

Kripa Social Welfare Society has a very strong, motivated and experienced team consisting of social workers, trainers, accountant support staff and field workers. These team members are rendering their service in different fields (part-time and full time) to achieve the vision, mission and objectives of the organisation. 90 staff members and 28 volunteers are working in the organisation. Two Staff members get more than Rs. 20000/- per month 15 staff members get Rs. 10000/- to Rs. 20000/- per month and 73 staff members get Rs. 6000 to Rs. 10000 per month as their remuneration.

Activities:

Kripa Social Welfare Society has been involved in multi-dimensional social welfare programmes such as women empowerment programme, child rights & child protection, health related programme, livelihood, natural resource management & watershed, agriculture, good governance, gender and peace & harmony. Kripa tries to cover all segments of the community such as women, farmers, adolescents and children, in its working area. Certainly to a certain extent Kripa has succeeded to organize all these sections of the community by forming community based organizations in many of its villages. Various training programmes were conducted by Kripa in the field to capacitate the beneficiaries to play their active role in the implementation of the projects. All these efforts have helped Kripa to ensure the dynamic support from people in the area and people have brought out many results in the field. Following descriptions would give us an overview of the activities and outcomes accomplished by Kripa in the financial year 2019-2020.



Agriculture and Natural Resource Management

Voracious attitude of our farmers towards money has pushed the farmers from the traditional approach to chemical farming. Cultivation has changed from food crops to cash crops, organic farming to chemical farming and mixed crops to mono crops. Profound dependency of farmers on the market for seeds, fertilizer and pesticide has reduced ownership and freedom of farmers in the farming. In the present scenario, market decides what farmers have to cultivate and which pesticide farmers have to use in their field. All these changes have made cultivation more expensive. Small and marginalised farmers are struggling to meet the expenses of the cultivation. Even after all these difficulties farmers are not ready to change the farming pattern from chemical to traditional farming. In such a situation Kripa is working among the farmers especially the small and marginalised farmers to orient them towards sustainable and profitable agriculture which may effectively reduce hunger and poverty by increasing the economic escalation through profitable and sustainable agricultural practices. One of the methods adopted by Kripa is to organise the farmers through the formation of farmers clubs. Farmers club becomes a platform for the farmers to come together and discuss various aspects of farming. Kripa social welfare society has been providing training to the farmers on different concepts like



traditional farming, forest based resources & indigenous food, organic farming, kitchen garden, climate resilience agriculture, mixed cropping, tree plantation, agriculture related schemes from horticulture and agriculture department etc. Kripa has arranged seed fair and food fair in the villages to promote traditional farming and traditional food among the farmers in the villages. All together Kripa has organised 2782 activities related to agriculture in the villages and 41569 participants have benefited from these trainings.

Kripa has been working among the marginalised and small farmers with an aim to bring them back to sustainable, profitable and eco-friendly agriculture. The hard work and constant efforts of the staff could make following results in the field by mobilising the farmers. Project could make 79 new farmers clubs in the project villages. Of course our programme could make modest changes in the mind of the famers and as a consequence a few farmers have shown partial interest to do eco friendly, profitable and sustainable agriculture.

890 farmers have tapped government schemes worth Rs. 6620500/- from Agriculture and Horticulture Departments and 729 women members of Self Help Groups have taken Rs. 4775880/- for agriculture related purposes. 210 farmers have cultivated vegetables in their field and sold vegetables worth Rs. 501650.

Child Rights and Child Protection:

Children are one of the vulnerable groups in the community. Many children have been deprived from their rights. They are victims of different types of exploitation and abuses. Majority of the children are not given the opportunity to execute their rights, especially the right to participation and development. Main reason for this disadvantage is due to the ignorance of the community and children about child rights. Children hardly get an opportunity to take their decision regarding their life, their needs. To ensure a child friendly atmosphere in the



target area, Kripa has been working among the community by providing training to the community on child rights and protection. Kripa has formed children clubs in the villages and slums to bring the children together and to help them develop their skills to work for the welfare of the children. Kripa runs three CHILD LINES to protect and safeguard the needy children.

Child Line in collaboration with allied system has rescued child labourers, child beggars and stopped child marriage in the area. Many needy children were helped. Many children who were out of home were either given shelter in a shelter home and sent back to their own home by the order of the Child Welfare Committee. Kripa offers different rehabilitation activities like yoga training, skill training, music classes, celebration of feast and birth days in the Juvenile Justice Homes for the welfare of the children. In this reporting period 727 needy children were helped through the Child Line. All together Kripa has conducted 4048 activities covering 59082 children or adults.

All above mentioned activities helped Kripa to reach out to thousands of children through an awareness programme on child rights and child protection. As on today Kripa Social Welfare Society has 196 children's groups mobilising 4518 children. Kripa has supported 92 dropout children to get admission in formal schools and 5 children to submit applications for either 10th or 8th standards exam. Children in the children's parliament, from villages, have referred 26 cases to Child Line Ujjain. Different projects have assisted 176 children to tap education related government schemes worth Rs. 504000/-. Members of the self help groups (1410) have taken Rs. 3470285/- for the purpose of the education of their children. Kripa has helped 727 needy children (medical support to 32 children, 37 cases related to missing, 1193 children under the category of protection from abuse, 101 cases under the category of sponsorship, 139 children were given emotional support and guidance, 41 children were given shelter, 32 child lost cases, etc.) through the effective and timely intervention of Child Line. Children have raised 13 social issues and found solutions for five issues raised by them. 55 children in Juvenile Justice Home have received training either on bag making or tailoring. Through this Kripa reached out to the children and helped them to enjoy their rights.

Women Empowerment

Elderly women in the villages are illiterate. Women in the villages seldom get the opportunity to make decisions. In a strict sense their status in the society is very low. They are not organised. They do not take part in the process of good governance in the local government. Mostly they are dependent. Kripa has been implementing different activities to bring social, economic, technical, educational and political empowerment of the women through



mobilisation and capacity building. As a first step Kripa has formed Self Help Groups for the women in the villages and slums. These community based organisations have helped the women to come together and to develop their saving habits through regular savings in the self help groups. Gradually women began to take internal loans from the self help groups and either they started new alternative income generation units or expanded existing income generation units. Women were provided different training on rights, Gram Sabha, nature and functions of SHGs, financial literacy, government schemes, public hearing, leadership etc. Many women have taken loans from banks and started income generation activities. Women from different villages have attended Gram Sabha and public hearing with their issues. They have submitted applications in Gram Sabha and government departments to tap social security schemes. Kripa has conducted 758 activities in the field for the empowerment of women in the villages and 13367 women participated in these meetings. Kripa has formed 87 new Self Help groups in this reporting period.

Kripa could form 955 Self Help Groups throughout these years by organising (11875) unorganised women in the villages and slums areas of its target area. Formation of self help groups have helped the women to develop saving habits in them. They have taken money from the groups and started income generation programmes. Members of the Self Help Groups have also taken loan from SHGS for education purposes of their children (1410), treatment (174), agriculture purpose (890) and housing (344). We feeling, oneness, cooperation and collaboration increased among the women in the villages. Women have developed their confidence, communication and negotiation skills and ability to take decisions in their families and in society. Women in the Self Help Groups actively participate in the Gram Sabha meetings and public hearing with their local issues.

Health

Another thematic area of Kripa's intervention is community health. Kripa has been working for the good health of mothers and children in the communities. Kripa mainly works among the adolescent girls, children and pregnant women in the villages and slums of its working area. Both preventive and curative aspects of the health are being dealt with the organisation. Kripa has organised different training programmes in the communities to conscientize the target group on TB, HIV/AIDS, malnutrition, Pre-natal and antenatal care,



institutional delivery, personal hygiene, health and sanitation, scheme related to health etc. Under TB project Kripa has reached out to 105 villages and covered 18241 households through Akshay Samwad. Kripa has formed 113 adolescent groups covering 1354 adolescent girls. Kripa Social Welfare Society has conducted 1037 activities in the villages and slums to conscientize the community about their good health and 16843 people participated in these activities. Adolescent girls and pregnant

women were advised to consume balanced diet in their food. Women are being encouraged and motivated to start kitchen gardens at their houses to cultivate needed vegetables for their food. Again facilitation meetings were conducted in the villages with elderly people to identify naturally grown vegetables in the field.

Saathi the HIV/AIDS unit of Kripa has reached out to 385 villages through its awareness programmes. It has done rapid test programmes in 473 villages covering 11314 populations. Beside these, rapid test organisation has conducted 607 other activities like rally, awareness programmes to various target groups like: college students, school students, pregnant women, health workers, anganwadi workers and all together 20433 participants participated in these activities. Saathi also has done other services like home visits, follow up visits, nutrition support, educational support, mutual support meetings, coordination meeting, etc., for the welfare of the PLHAs and their families. Saathi also supported the PLHAs through IP services (66 are newly identified cases) OP services to 471 PLHAs.



One of the areas of the backwardness in the life of the people is health and sanitation. Different health related awareness and training programmes brought changes in the attitude and thinking of villagers toward their health. Mothers started to give attention to their children and their health. Pregnant women, adolescent girls and children have started to benefit from the Anganwadies. Following are some of the main outcomes of the health related programme under Kripa.

One hundred and seventy four members of the Self Help Groups have taken loans worth Rs. 1109500 from Self Help Groups for the purpose of treatment. Community members (1666) have benefitted from different health related government schemes. Total health related government schemes tapped by community members were worth Rs. 2313905.

Rapid Testing programme has enabled Saathi to identify 66 new HIV infected cases and all of them are linked with ICTC and 61 patients have started the ART. Saathi's support helped 95 PLHAs to improve their CD4. Five PLHAs were supported to start income generation programmes. 1569 pregnant women were found in the target area and out these 1090 women have done the HIV test (423 women did the test because of the motivation of the project team). 188 PLHAs or affected individuals were supported to tap health related schemes or government schemes related to social security schemes. Saathis' facilitation meetings helped PLHAs to tap government schemes worth Rs. 1797250/-. PLHAs have formed two self help groups covering 29 PLHAs and they are having Rs. 72420 as their savings. During this reporting period Saathi has identified 13 HIV/AIDs positive pregnant women and nine women gave birth to children. Seven children were born negative and two children born positive.

Livelihood

Kripa mainly concentrates its works in rural areas. The main livelihood option of the villages is agriculture. Disguised unemployment is found in the agriculture sector. In the villages we also find land less households, marginalised farmers and small farmers who find it difficult to meet the needs of their life. Lack of alternative livelihood skills and lack of capital and credit facilities are some of the problems faced by the community to start alternative income generation units. Kripa has adopted the strategy to form self help groups in the villages to bring the poor and marginalised women together and facilitate them to start saving in their SHGs. Another strategy





adopted by Kripa is to provide skill development training to women and dropout children in the villages and slums. Kripa Social welfare Society organised different trainings to dropout youth and women on alternative income generation programmes, EDP, life skills etc. Saving in the self help groups becomes a great relief for the women to take loan to begin income generation units. Besides this women also tap schemes from government department, loan from banks to start the income generation units. Kripa has organised 304 facilitation meetings with the beneficiaries on different topics connected with livelihood. Kripa has conducted skills development



programmes to youth, children and women on tailoring, bag making, computer, house wiring, security guard, craft items etc. Some of the beneficiaries have taken loans from Self Help Groups and from banks to do agriculture related livelihood program and the one related to animal husbandry. Kripa's experience is that most of the women in the self help groups have started their income generation units by taking loan from SHGs. Majority of those women are successful in their endeavor. They do repay the loan taken for the purpose of income generation units. Following are the main achievements of the target people in the area.

Kripa team has facilitated the community members especially the youth about the available government schemes for livelihood. Facilitation meetings have motivated youth to submit applications to the government departments to tap self employment schemes. Community members have tapped Rs. 561300/- for self-employment.

Good Governance:

Community members must be the prime agents for the development of any community. People's active participation is inevitable for the development of any community. Unfortunately the majority of the community members are not part of the development process in the villages. They do feel that any development in the villages is the responsibility of the government. People do not have any role to play. Kripa Social Welfare Society is working in the community keeping the view to mobilise them to work with the Panchayat for the development of their villages and to motivate the people to ensure their rights. Formation of Self Help Groups and Core Groups and promotion of emerging local leaders from the community are aimed at promoting the community to take their initiative for the development of the villages. Kripa has conducted various training session on different concepts like Gram Sabha, government schemes, social issues, micro plan, leadership, networking, public hearing, etc., to develop leadership quality in the people. Different activities are being implemented to increase the knowledge of the community members, develop their skills and confidence. Kripa facilitates the people to understand their rights, access public services and to increase their participation in solving problems.

Capacity building programmes and mobilisation of community has made visible changes in the attitude and participation of people especially of women in the development works of the villages. Community has identified and selected leaders from them. Under their leadership people have submitted 140 applications either in Panchayat or government departments to find solutions for their local issues. The effort of the people found success in solving 54 issues by the support of local government and 11 issues were solved by volunteer work. 777 people from different villages have attended public hearings and 5085 community members have participated in the Gram Sabha meetings with their issues. People have tapped government schemes worth Rs.27326900 and submitted 1289 new applications in the panchayat and other government departments to tap individual government schemes. At present there are 34 core groups in 34 villages who have made micro plans and identified and prioritized their local issues.





Staff Development Programmes

Kripa Social Welfare Society has organised different in-house trainings for its staff during this reporting period. Kripa has sent its staff to attend external training too. All these training and exposure programmes have really capacitated the staff to render their services for the welfare of the community especially the women and children.



Networking, Liaison and Capacity Building

Kripa Social Welfare Society believes that net working with Government departments, like minded NGOs and local



governments are basic for achieving the goal of any project. Hence Kripa has established networking with different Government Departments like Educational Department, Agriculture Department, Horticulture Department, KVK, Forest Department, NRC, Police Department, Health Department, Child Welfare Committee, Social Justice Department, Women and Child Development, for the effective implementation as well as the capacity building of target communities. KNH, Social Justice Department, NABARD, AHF, CRS, FVTRS, Caritas India, Misereor and Kindermissionwerk are our donors who support KSWS financially and technically to accomplish its mission and vision. Kripa has established a good relationship with MPSS, MPVSS, MPISSR, Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Nashamukti Kendra, Social work department of Vikram University and Ambedkar Peeth to bring changes in the community through a collective effort. This reporting time is an opportunity to remember the contribution given by above-mentioned agencies to Kripa to reach out to our target group with efficiency and commitment.

Conclusion:

Kripa Social Welfare Society is working in four civil districts covering 15 blocks, 225 panchayats and 262 villages and 13 wards in its target area. Beside these targeted villages Kripa has reached out to other 78 villages with TB awareness programmes. As on today Kripa is having 955 Self Help Groups, 94 farmers groups, 12 youth groups, 196 children groups, 113 adolescent groups and 34 core groups in the villages and slums of its target area. Utthan and Aarambh for community development, Skill development project for dropout youth, Railway Child Line in Ujjain and city Child Line in Agar for children who are in need of care and protection are the new projects which were launched in this year. All these outcomes and results became possible due to the constant blessings of God the Father and the hard work of many missionaries in the diocese, the staff of Kripa and collaboration of many likeminded NGOs and Gvt. Departments. Let me take this opportunity to thank everyone who was instrumental in reaching out to hundreds of villages and thousands of people to bring changes in their life and attitude towards development.

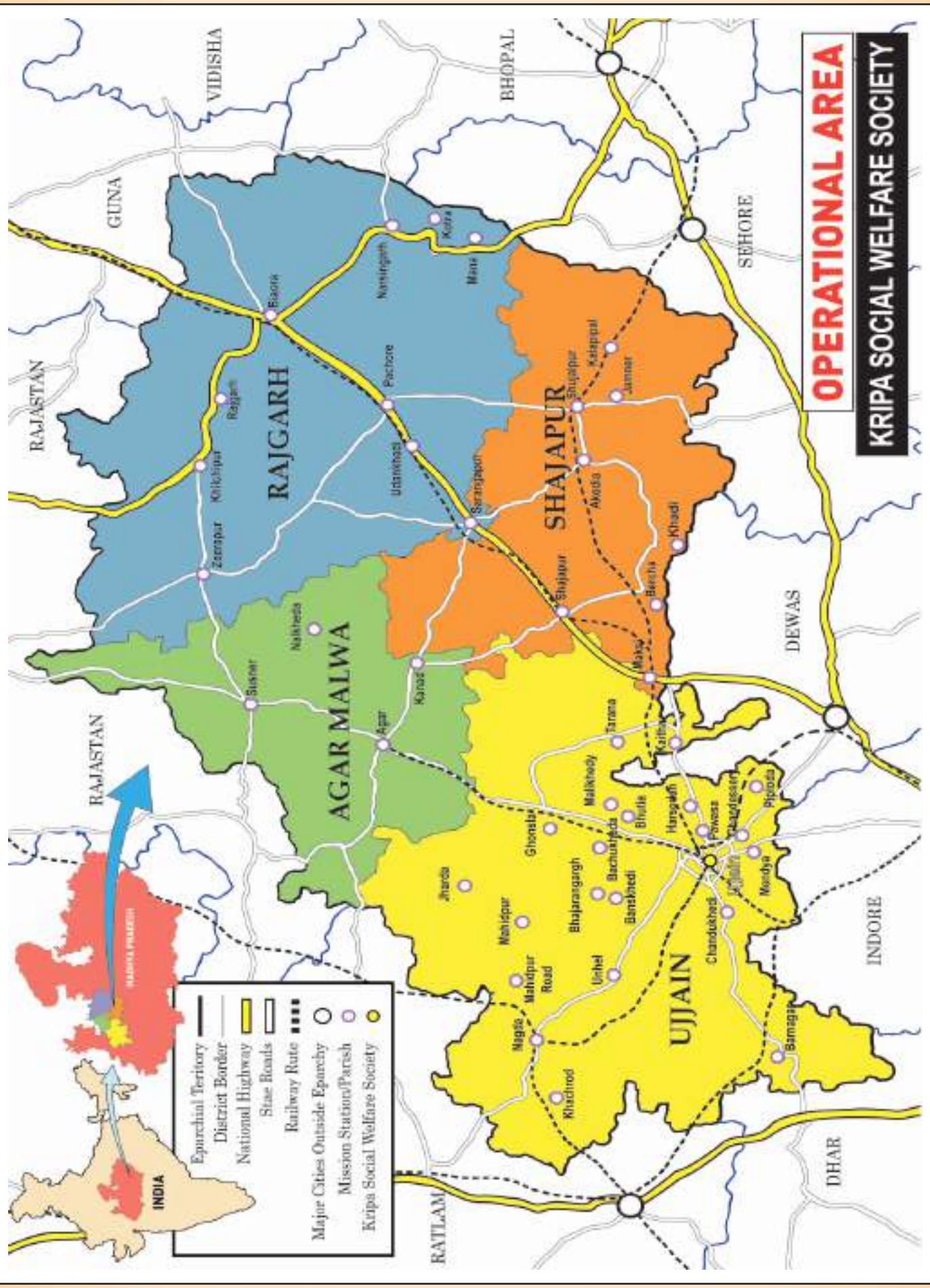
